OTTERHAMPTON COMMUNITY PLAN STEERING GROUP.

Earlier this year we completed our Community Plan after an extensive consultation process which included a Saturday Drop-in Session when everyone was encouraged to paint their vision of the future of our parish. A Community Plan Steering Group was set up, and with the help of the Somerset Community Council and Sedgemoor District Council, they eventually produced the Plan which was approved by the parish council. Copies available from the parish council.

This Community Plan which has been submitted to Sedgemoor District Council will influence future developments in the parish.

The Steering Group quickly established a number of working groups to develop the most popular ideas expressed at the drop-in session. As a result: -

- <u>A Community Market Group</u> was establish and is working closely with the Village Hall Committee to organise the excellent monthly market in the Village Hall.
- <u>A Cycling Group</u> dedicated to improving cycling access throughout the parish and beyond was established and is meeting regularly.
- A <u>Ponds Working Group</u> was also set up to consider access and wildlife and other environmental issues with the help of a local wildlife expert.
- A <u>Housing Group</u> was established to examine the was a need for affordable housing in the parish. A Housing Needs Survey has recently been conducted and a full analysis is awaited.
- The <u>Village Hall Committee</u> was already well established but new active members were required. Volunteers were found and the committee is currently considering various options for the development of this crucial community facility. Expect more on this in the New Year.

The Steering group are planning an AGM in February (date to be announced) to review progress so far and to provide a further opportunity for community involvement in the development of our plans for the future of our parish. BIG CHANGES on STEART PENINSULAR

By now most readers will be aware of two schemes that will radically change the face of the Steart peninsula.

The Bristol Port Company (TBPC) is planning to create 130ha of saltmarsh and intertidal mud flat extending westward from Stert Drove to the coast. This will be achieved by realignment of the flood embankment inland to the pylon line and allowing tidal incursion through a breach in the coastal shingle bank between Wall Common and Catfsford Common. This project is required in mitigation for habitat loss through a planned harbour extension at Avonmouth.

The Environment Agency (EA) is planning to create a more extensive area (500ha) of wetland habitat. This will extend from Stert Drove to the Parrett and also north of Stockland Bristol. A single breach will be made in the Parrett Bank and realigned flood banks built, which will run inland to the Drove and south of Steart village to create intertidal salt marsh. Low-lying land to the north of Stockland Bristol will form a freshwater wetland and the area south of the pylon line will have a controlled salt water inlet to create an area of brackish marsh. This scheme is being implemented by the EA to comply with a legal obligation to create coastal marsh under the EU Habitats Directive.

Both schemes are about to submit full planning applications, and if successful, works might start in 2012; although EA have already done some advanced work alongside Steart Drove to build a trial embankment and as mitigation for the loss of freshwater habitat within the intertidal area.



The TBPC scheme will be managed by the RSPB and the EA scheme by the Wildfowl and Wetland Trust. The declared intention for both schemes is to work together to provide integrated access and limited visitor facilities. These schemes, together with the Bridgwater Bay NNR and associated SSSIs, will create on Steart peninsula an extensive and varied area of significant importance for conserving a diminishing coastal wetland habitat. Although the schemes are primarily intended to create an alternative habitat, they will also improve the current flood defence to threatened residences on and around the peninsula and their access.

HISTORY of COMBWICH

The Historical Village tour , organised by OPRA, earlier this year stimulated huge interest.

The guided tour was enhanced by the attendance of a number of people who have lived in the village for a significant number of years. They highlighted the considerable changes with



their memories of growing up in Combwich.



It is important that this history is documented for the future benefit of the community. We are a small village with a long history going back at least to Roman times. What do you know about the history of Combwich? Have you any tales or old pictures? Would you be interested in helping to compile and preserve this history?
