- The parish council is the first tier of local government and is an elected body with tax raising powers representing the villages of Comwich, Otterhampton and Steart.
- 7 councillors represent the parish and they have a 4 year term of office. The council is elected en bloc every 4 years.
- Your council is responsible for items such as the children's playground, grass cutting, the village gardener, notice boards, benches, dog and litter bins, defibrillator, some path and road maintenance and enhancement projects.
- Your council owns the common and is responsible for its management.
- Your council represented the interest of the community in the development of the Steart Marshes and was responsible for the negotiations with EDF including the £500,000 allocated to the parish from the Community Impact Mitigation Fund (CIM Fund).
- Your council needs interested members of the public to become involved in the work of the council.

Meetings are held on the first Thursday of the month in the village hall and the public is welcome to attend.
